

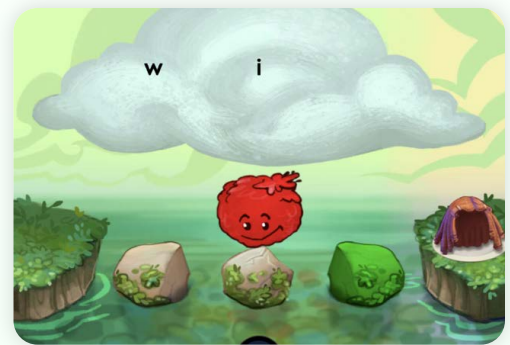

Provide students with explicit instruction in all 5 elements of reading.

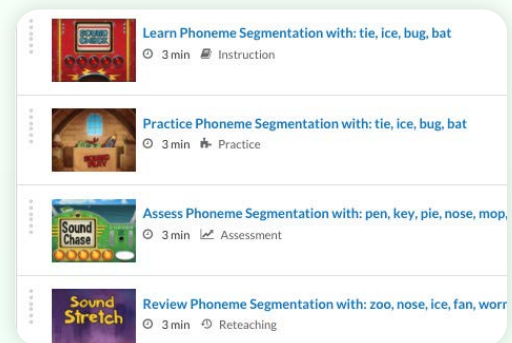

Give each student the exact content they need, right when they need it.

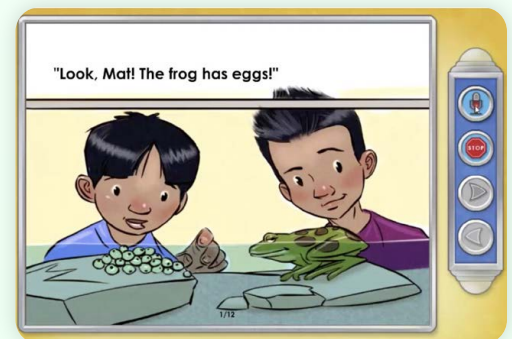
Personalized learning pathways provide additional practice and instruction when students struggle with a skill or concept. Teachers can even create custom playlists of activities based on identified instructional needs.

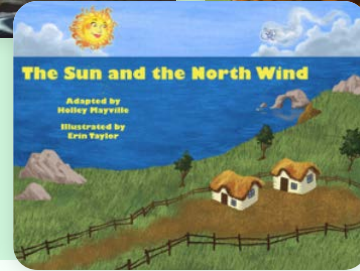
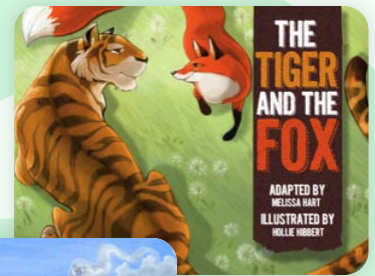
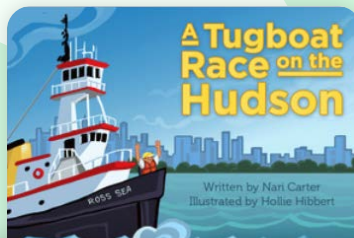
